The bill to alter and change the time for holding the county courts in Washington county, was

read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk. RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to subscribe for fity copies of the abridgment of the laws of Maryland, as now publishing by Thomas Herty, of the city of Baltimore, and to pay the amount of the subscription money out of any unapapropriated money in the treasury.

RESOLVED, That the governor and council be and they are hereby directed to transmit one copy of the faid abridgment of the laws to each of the county court clerks and registers of wills in the leveral counties of this state, for the use of their respective courts, one copy thereof to the register of the chancery court, one copy to the register of the land-office, one copy to the treasurer of the western and eastern shores respectively, one copy to the clerk of the western and eastern shore general courts respectively, and one copy to the register of the land-office on the eastern shore, one copy to be retained by the governor and council for their own use, one copy to the clerk of the court of appeals, and the remaining three copies for the use of the general affembly of this state.

Mr. Hollingsworth, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to alter the times of holding the county courts in Cæcil, Queen-Anne's and Talbot counties; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Key, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act declaring what shall be evidence in certain cases therein mentioned; which was read the single

time and ordered to lie on the table.

Whereas William Ferguson hath represented to this general assembly, that he hath an equitable claim against the state of Maryland on account of a deficiency in the quantity of certain lands bought by faid Ferguson from the state of Maryland, and also that he is debarred from exercising the legal and customary means of obtaining redrefs in the court of chancery in confequence of certain proceedings heretofore had in faid court in relation to faid purchase: And whereas this general affembly are willing and defirous to place the faid Ferguson in the same situation as if faid purchase had never been brought in any manner into question before said court; therefore RESOLVED, That the chancellor be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to hear and determine the claim or claims which the faid William Ferguson may have against the state on account of the purchase asoresaid, in the same manner as if no proceedings had ever taken place in the chancery court in relation to the faid purchase.

AND RESOLVED, That in case the chancellor should decree in favour of the said William Ferguson, the treasurer of the western shore pay to the said William Ferguson the amount of such

decree, agreeably to the terms thereof.

Mr. Key, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a report on the petitions

of infolvent debtors; which was read. RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY, That the governor and council be authorifed to purchase, and cause to be handsomely framed, two sets of the prints executed by Trumbull, the American artilt, in commemoration of the battle of Bunker's Hill, and attack on Quebec, two memorable epochs in the history of our revolution, and the same, when finished, to be hung up in some conspicuous part of the house of delegates and senate chamber.

The resolution respecting the appointment of justices of the peace, was read the second time,

differted from, and fent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Wright and Mr. Ridgely have leave of absence. The bill to establish and incorporate a medical and chirurgical faculty or fociety in the state of Maryland, was read the second time, and the question put, That the faid bill do pass? The year and nays being required, appeared as follow:
