The supplement to an act directing the time, places and manner, of holding elections for representatives of this state in the congress of the United States, and for appointing electors on the part of this state for choosing a president and vice-president of the United States, and for the regulation of the said elections, and also to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, endorsed; "By the senate, January 15, 1799: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
