BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, JANUARY 19, 1799.

GENTLEMEN OF THE SENATE,

WE have negatived the bill, entitled, An act to repeal the parts of the constitution therein mentioned. If the senate will proceed, agreeably to the request contained in our message of this morning, we will carry the proposition made in that message into full effect.

We return the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled, An act to alter, abolish and repeal, such parts of the second, third, fourteenth and forty-second sections of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the judges, time, place and manner, of holding the several elections therein specified, and the bill to regulate elections, in hopes that the senate, upon reconsideration, will pass the same; should they, however, refuse to reconsider, we must let the subject sleep in silence until awakened by our constituents.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay annually, on the first day of May in each year, to the visitors and directors of the grammar school in Elizabeth-town, in Washington county, the sum of two hundred dollars, the same to be paid out of any unappropriated money in said treasury, and applied by said directors and visitors to the purposes and for the use of said school; provided that no money shall be paid in any year by the said treasurer, unless he shall be satisfied that there are at least twelve scholars in said school who are studying the learned languages.
