RESOLVED, That Richard Key Watts be and he is hereby authorized and directed to provide stationery and candles sufficient for the next session of assembly, and that he lay before this house an account of the money so laid out by him in the purchase of the aforesaid articles.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to advance to the said Richard Key Watts the sum of two hundred dollars for the purpose of procuring stationery and candles for the use of the next general assembly.

Sent to the senate by the clerk. RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay the sum of three thousand dollars to the mayor of the city of Baltimore, to be by him applied to the completing and furnishing the hospital in Baltimore county for the relief of indigent sick persons, and the reception and care of patients, provided that the said mayor shall first give bond, with security, for the due and faithful application of the said sum of money to the purpose aforesaid, and provided also, that the said treasurer shall first be assured and satisfied, that the inhabitants of Baltimore county have also contributed
