Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, and John Campbell, Efquires, from the senate, acquaint the speaker that the senate request his attendance, with the members of the house of delegates, in

Wilmer, James Thomas and John Davidson, Esquires, had a majority of votes.

Whereupon RESOLVED, That Thomas Buchanan, Arthur Shaaff, Jonathan R. Wilmer, James Thomas and John Davidson, Esquires, be, and they are hereby declared to be, the council to

the governor.

Mr. P. Thomas and Mr. Warfield have leave of absence for one week. The house adjourns till to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the said Henry Hall Dorsey, Isaac Dorsey and Elizabeth Dorsey, or their order, the aforesaid sum of ninety pounds, the valuation of the said negro slave Tom.
