

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1801. 15

On motion, Leave given to bring in a supplement to the act to freighten and amend the public roads in Harford county, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned. ORDERED, That Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Forwood, Mr. Stanbury, Mr. Lytle and Mr. Dalhiell, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Love, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to enable the Zion church congregations to finish and complete their house of public worship in Baltimore county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

S A T U R D A Y, November 7, 1801.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Nicholas R. Moore, a delegate returned for Baltimore, Mr. Edward H. Veazy, a delegate returned for Cæcil county, Mr. Elijah Davis, a delegate returned for Harford county, Mr. William Dorsey, a delegate returned for Anne-Arundel county, and Mr. Luke White Barber, a delegate returned for Saint-Mary's county, appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking the oath to support the constitution of the United States, took their seats in the house.

Petitions from Charles Forman, of the city of Baltimore, William Brown, of Joseph, of Kent county, Washington Drane, of Montgomery county, James P. Ewing, of Cæcil county, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to extend the powers of the levy court of Allegany county relative to roads in said county. ORDERED, That Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Simkins, Mr. Chapman, Mr. Cresap and Mr. Harwood, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Lowes, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to open a road from John and Isaac Hearn's mill, in Worcester county, to intersect the main road leading from Salisbury to Blackfoot; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from Mary and David Lamb, counter to the petition of Daniel Lamb, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee on the petition to which it is counter.

A petition from Joshua Lamb, praying that the prayer of the petition of Daniel Lamb may be granted, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee on the petition of Daniel Lamb.

A petition from John Gassaway, register of wills of Anne-Arundel county, praying an increase of fees, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee on the petition of sundry sheriffs.

A petition from the heirs of George Manka, of Baltimore county, deceased, praying the register of the land-office may be authorized to grant a patent for certain lands to Elizabeth Manka, wife of the said George, and her children, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Lemmon, Mr. Montgomery and Mr. Love, to consider and report thereon.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the council for the ensuing year, endorsed; "By the senate, November 6, 1801: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table."

THE committee to whom was referred the representation of Charles Emory, Esquire, examiner-general of the eastern shore, report, that they have examined the same, and find it made agreeably to the requisites of the act of assembly on that subject, and that the said examiner, from the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred, to the twenty-second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and one, has examined one hundred and twelve certificates, for which he has received the sum of ninety-three pounds nineteen shillings; and that there
