

T U E S D A Y, November 24, 1801.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. E. Davis. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Burgeis appeared in the house.

A petition from a sect of people called Jews, praying that the incapacities which they now labour under agreeably to the constitution and laws of this state may be removed, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Scott, Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Goldsborough, Mr. Dickson and Mr. Jones, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from John Eager Howard, of Baltimore county, counter to the petition of fundry inhabitants of the city of Baltimore, respecting a street to be made across the Bafon, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

A petition from Charles Scott, of Prince-George's county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

A petition from Thomas Dyer, of Prince-George's county, praying the levy court of Prince-George's county may be authorized to levy a sum of money on said county for the support of his afflicted son, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Bowie, Mr. Van-Horn and Mr. Wood, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from John Dames, and others, securities of Henry Costin, late sheriff of Queen-Anne's county, praying they may be authorized to collect the balances due the said sheriff, and vesting in them a property in the fees, accounts, and all other papers relating to the office of the said sheriff, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Lowrey, Mr. Montgomery and Mr. Scott, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from James Calhoun, of the city of Baltimore, counter to the petition of fundry inhabitants of the city of Baltimore for the extension of Light-street, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

Mr. Cresap, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for establishing a turnpike road from the burnt mill, about one mile below the mouth of George's creek, on the Patowmack river, to the nearest western navigation; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, the question was put, That the second reading of the report and resolution on the memorial of Alexander Martin and the remonstrance of Frederick Green, be postponed until to-morrow? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
