A petition from Thomas Roiston, of Baltimore county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

On motion, the question was put, That the bill relative to the administration of justice in the several counties of this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, be committed for amendment? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

Mr. Thomas, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the regulating the mode of staying execution, and repealing the acts of assembly therein mentioned, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Chapman, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to regulate public ferries; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from Charles Queen, of Allegany county, praying the chancellor may be authorized to vacate the patent issued in the name of Peter Dugan instead of Patrick Dugan, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Cresap, Mr. Goldsbrough and Mr. B. Tomlinson, to consider and report thereon.

The bill to incorporate the Roman catholic congregation in Saint-Mary's county, known by the name of Saint-Nicholas's Congregation, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Swearingen, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the trustees of the poor of Montgomery county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Lloyd, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Alexander Laing, of Talbot county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The further supplement to an act to straighten and amend the public roads in Harford county, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to repair the old or to build a new poor-house in Anne-Arundel county. ORDERED, That Mr. W. Dorley, Mr. L. Dorley, Mr. Ridgely, Mr. Harwood and Mr. Quynn, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill to relinquish the right of this state to the tract of land therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.
