A memorial from the justices of the orphans court, justices of the levy court, and justices of the peace, of Dorchester county, respecting the return of attachments, increase of per diem and constables fees, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Steele, Mr. Lloyd, Mr. Lowrey, Mr. Thompson and Mr. Moffit, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. E. Davis, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorizing a lottery in Havre-de-Grace, for the purpose therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill relative to the security to be hereafter given by the treasurers of this state. ORDERED, That Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Lloyd and Mr. E. Davis, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Chapman, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the representatives of Nicholas Merryman, late of Baltimore county, deceased; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. J. Tomlinfon, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to correct a mistake in the beginning of lot number three thousand two hundred and eighty-seven of the lands lying westward of Fort Cumberland; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to erect a town in Queen-Anne's county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, counter to the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county for laying out a road from Baltimore-town to Liberty-town, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

The bill respecting the public roads in Washington county, was read the second time and passed.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a supplement to an act, entitled, An act to prevent the going at large of geese and swine in the town of Havre-de-Grace, in Harford county. ORDERED, That Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Forwood and Mr. E. Davis, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Thomas, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the supplement to an act, entitled, An act for regulating the mode of staying execution, and repealing the acts of assembly therein mentioned, and for other purposes, as amended; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
