THE house met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Lloyd and Mr. Alexander. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. W. Neale and Mr. Tillotson have leave of absence.

Petitions from Peter Medford, of Dorchester county, Richard Chew, of Anne-Arundel county, and Samuel B. Beall, of Allegany county, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. Quynn, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the establishment and regulation of the levy courts in the several counties in this state; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to raise by lottery a sum of money to build a bridge over Wicomico river, at the town of Salisbury, in Somerset county. ORDERED, That Mr. Holbrook, Mr. Dashiell, Mr. Hyland, Mr. Purnell and Mr. Williams, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill respecting evidence in certain cases. ORDERED, That Mr. Chapman, Mr. Quynn, Mr. Goldsborough, Mr. P. Stuart and Mr. Jones, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

A petition from William Ashmore, of Harford county, praying the register of the land office may be authorised to receive into the land-office a certificate for a tract of land called John's Adventure, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Montgomery, Mr. E. Davis and Mr. Forwood, to consider and report thereon.

The bill to incorporate the German evangelic lutheran congregation of Elizabeth-town, Washington county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The report on the petition of John Starrett, and others, was read the second time, the resolutions therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.
