

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1801. 67

Mr. Scott, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the collecting of duties or tolls on merchandize and other articles carried out of or brought into this state on the bed of the river Sulquehanna, and augmenting the number of canal shares; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

ORDERED, That the same have a second reading on Wednesday next.

A petition from Matthias Bartgis, of Frederick county, praying he may be authorized by lottery to raise the sum of £. 500, for the purpose of promoting a circulating library, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Kemp, Mr. Nelson, Mr. Hebb, Mr. Tilghman and Mr. Quinton, to consider and report thereon.

The bill for the relief of Henry Troup was read the second time and passed.

Mr. W. Dorsey, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to enable John Sprigg Belt, James Walker and Archibald Dorsey, to complete the collection of the county tax in certain districts in Anne-Arundel county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Hebb, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to establish pilots, and to regulate their fees; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. ORDERED, That the same have a second reading on Monday next.

The order of the day respecting the bill to appoint an agent for the year 1802, is postponed till to-morrow morning.

Mr. Chapman, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act respecting evidence in certain cases; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from Joseph Duvall, of Prince-George's county, stating, that he sustained great loss by having his tobacco-house, with the tobacco therein and sundry other articles, destroyed by fire, and praying relief, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Van-Horn, Mr. Bowie and Mr. Wood, to consider and report thereon.

The bill to enable John Sprigg Belt, James Walker and Archibald Dorsey, to complete the collection of the county tax in certain districts in Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time by especial order and passed.

On the second reading of the bill to pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government, the question was put, That the printer to the state be allowed 1400 dollars per annum? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
