The clerk of the senate delivers the following resolution, viz.

BY THE SENATE, DECEMBER 9, 1801.

RESOLVED, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorized, on the commissioners of the city of Washington transferring, or causing to be transferred, on or before the fourth day of March next, to the trustee of this state, two hundred and fifty thousand dollars of stock of the United States, bearing an interest of six per cent. and on the payment to the treasurer of the western shore of the residue of the interest due, or to be due, on the loans made by the state to the said commissioners, in virtue of the resolutions passed in the years seventeen hundred and ninety-six, seventeen hundred and ninety-seven and seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, to the time of making the transfer, to cause all bonds, contracts or agreements to the state, made in virtue of the resolutions aforesaid, to be given up to be cancelled.

RESOLVED, That on the transfer of the stock aforesaid, and on the payment of interest aforesaid, all the estate, right, title, interest, claim or demand, which this state acquired of, in and to, any property in virtue of the loans made under the resolutions aforesaid, and of the act of congress, entitled, An act authorizing a loan for the use of the city of Washington, in the district of Columbia, and for other purposes therein mentioned, be and the same is hereby released.
