

82 VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1807.

The bill for the relief of Hugh Coyle, of Frederick county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from Lewis Duvall, of Montgomery county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to authorise the appointment of visitors of the gaol in Baltimore county. ORDERED, That Mr. Dickson, Mr. Scott and Mr. Love, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The order of the day respecting the bill to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to voters and the qualification of voters, is postponed till Monday next.

On the second reading of the bill relative to the administration of justice in this state, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, the question was put, That the further consideration of the same be postponed until the next session of assembly?
