RESOLVED, That all proceedings be stayed until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and three, on a judgment or judgments obtained in the general court against William M'Mahan, Thomas Crefap, James Scott, Charles Frederick Brodhag, John Conrod Beatty, George Thistle, Ninian Cochran, George Dent, Thomas Stewart and James Crefap, of Michael, securities of Robert Sinclair, late sheriff of Allegany county, or any of them, and that they be released from the payment of nine per cent. imposed by law for the failure of the said Robert Sinclair to make payment into the treasury at the time prescribed by law of public monies collected by him, provided the said securities shall, on or before the said first day of January, eighteen hundred and three, pay the principal, and six per cent. interest, due on their several bonds, and costs of suit, and if any of the said securities shall comply with the condition aforesaid, such securities, so complying, shall not be precluded from the benefit of this resolution by the failure of any others so complying therewith.
