On motion, Leave given to bring in a supplement to an act, entitled, An act to alter and change the names of Charles Ridgely Carnan, and others, according to the will of captain Charles Ridgely, of Baltimore county, deceased. ORDERED, That Mr. Scott, Mr. Dickson and Mr. Moore, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion, ORDERED, That the report of the committee to whom leave was given to bring in a bill to alter such parts of the constitution as relate to the senate of Maryland, be committed for amendment.

On motion, ORDERED, That the committee on the petition of Daniel Clarke be discharged.

Mr. Scott, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to alter and change the names of Charles Ridgely Carnan, and others, according to the will of captain Charles Ridgely, of Baltimore county, deceased; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

So it was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Dickson, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to authorize the appointment of visitors of the gaol in Baltimore county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Dickson, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Robert Long, of Baltimore county, report, that they have taken the same under their consideration, and find the facts therein stated to be true; they therefore recommend the following resolutions:

RESOLVED, That the committee of claims be directed to allow to Robert Long, on the journal of accounts, the sum of sixty dollars as a compensation for the support and maintenance of negro Daniel, the property of the state, for the year eighteen hundred and one.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore shall and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay, out of any unappropriated money, the sum of sixty dollars per annum to the said Robert Long, or his order, in half yearly payments, for and during the life of the said negro Daniel, provided the said Robert Long shall continue to reside in this state, and support and maintain the said negro Daniel as heretofore.

RESOLVED, That if the said Robert Long should remove out of the state during the life-time of the said negro Daniel, he the said Robert Long shall, and he is hereby authorized and directed, previous to such removal, to contract with the trustees of the alms-house of Baltimore county for the support and maintenance of the said negro Daniel, at the rate of sixty dollars per annum, and that on producing a certificate from the said trustees of their having entered into such contract, and that they have received the said Daniel into the alms-house aforesaid, the said Robert Long shall be entitled to receive payment until the date of the said contract made with the trustees as aforesaid, and afterwards the said treasurer shall, and he is hereby directed, to pay to the order of the trustees aforesaid at the rate of sixty dollars per annum for and during the natural life of the said negro Daniel.

Mr. Nelson, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Philip Fischer, of Frederick county, a soldier in the late German regiment, report, that they have taken the same into their consideration, and find, from the auditor's books, that there was due to the said Philip Fischer, on the first day of August, 1780, the sum of £. 57 1 0 depreciation certificates, and that no part thereof hath ever been paid to the said Philip Fischer, or any other person. Your committee are therefore of opinion that the said Philip Fischer is justly entitled to the sum of £. 57 1 0 in specie from the state, and they therefore submit the following resolution, to wit:

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Philip Fischer, or order, the sum of £. 57 1 0 current money, out of any unappropriated money remaining in the treasury, after the payment of the journal of accounts, it being a balance due him from the state for his services as a soldier in the late German regiment.
