Mr. Van-Horn, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Hannah West, executrix of Stephen West, report, that they have taken the same under consideration, and find that Stephen West, late of Prince-George's county, paid into the treasury a large sum of continental money on account of debts due from him to British creditors, which sum of continental money was by an act of assembly passed at October session, 1780, authorized to be exchanged for bills of credit of the emission of June, 1780, at the rate of forty for one; the committee also find, that at November session, 1797, it was resolved, that the treasurer of the western shore should be thereby authorized to pay off and discharge the amount of principal and interest of such bills of credit of the emission under the act of June, 1780, as shall be produced and brought into the treasury on or before the first of October then
