A petition from Benjamin Hatcheson, of Kent county, praying credit on his bond for money due to the state. it being given for a larger fum than was actually due, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. A. Stuart, Mr. Scott and Mr. Thomas, to confider and report thereon.

Mr. Montgomery, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to streighten the post-

road leading from York to Baltimore; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Montgomery, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
