On motion, ORDERED, That the bill for the relief of Mary Faulkner, of Kent county, a lunatic, be referred to the first day of June next.

The bill respecting the register of wills for Calvert county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The report on the memorial of John H. Stone was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That the committee appointed on the said memorial prepare and bring in the same.

The report on the petition of John S. Brookes was read the second time, the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.
