

110 VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1801.

Mr. Quynn, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to vest the funds heretofore belonging to the rector, governor, trustees and visitors, of King William school, in the city of Annapolis, in the visitors and governors of Saint-John's college; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. P. Stuart is excused for absenting himself without leave.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill enabling the vestry of Saint-Paul's parish, in Baltimore county, to institute a seminary of learning, by the name of The Protestant Episcopal Academy of Baltimore, and to superintend the management thereof, be referred to the first day of August next.

The bill to vest the funds heretofore belonging to the rector, governor, trustees and visitors, of King William school, in the city of Annapolis, in the visitors and governors of Saint-John's college, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

A memorial from Uriah Forrest, stating, that he expended the sum of fifty-one pounds sterling in transacting business between Messrs. Vanstaphorst, of the city of Amsterdam, and the state of Maryland, and praying that the same may be refunded, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Ridgely, Mr. Lowes and Mr. Bowie, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Lowes, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the memorial of Uriah Forrest, report, that they have had the same under their consideration, and find that the claim which he sets up against the state is of long standing, and no vouchers accompany it whereby the same can be substantiated; they are therefore of opinion that the prayer thereof ought not to be granted.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill relative to the stock of the bank of England belonging to the state of Maryland, be committed for amendment.

Mr. Montgomery, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the bill relative to the stock of the bank of England belonging to the state of Maryland, as amended; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to prevent persons of colour being competent witnesses for or against any free white citizen of this state in cases therein mentioned. ORDERED, That Mr. Chapman, Mr. Anderson and Mr. Douglass, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion, ORDERED, That the committee of claims allow to the reverend Mr. Wyatt the sum of eighty dollars for his services as chaplain during the present session, and that the same be placed on the journal of accounts.

On the second reading of the amendment to the bill to straighten and amend the road leading from Leonard town, in Saint-Mary's county, to Newport, in Charles county; which amendment is as follows, to wit: "And be it enacted, That the said road shall not run through any persons lands in Charles county without his or their consent, any thing in said act to the contrary notwithstanding," the question was put, That the house agree to the said amendment? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
