

118 VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1801.

BY THE SENATE, DECEMBER 31, 1801.

RESOLVED, That the governor transmit to our representatives in congress a copy of the resolutions passed this session, relative to the loan of the six per cent. stock to the commissioners of the city of Washington, together with a copy of the commissioners memorial, and to request their aid in obtaining a transfer of the stock, and the payment of interest thereon, according to the terms of the resolutions.

RESOLVED, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorized to settle the account of Frederick Green, printer to the state, for printing and binding Kilty's laws, and to draw an order in his favour on the treasurer of the western shore for such balance as they may determine to be due to him.
