A sufficient number of delegates being convened, they severally qualified in the presence of each other, by taking the several oaths required by the constitution and form of government, subscribing a declaration of their belief in the christian religion, and by taking, repeating and subscribing, the oath to support the constitution of the United States.

The house proceeded to ballot for a speaker, and the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, the gentlemen named to strike retired, and after sometime returned and reported, that the honorable Charles Frazier was unanimously elected.

The house appointed Mr. William Harwood clerk. ORDERED, That he qualify as such, by taking the several oaths required, subscribing a declaration of his belief in the christian religion, and by taking an oath that he will honestly, faithfully and diligently, discharge the office of clerk to the house of delegates, and that he will not reveal or disclose the secrets thereof.

The house proceeded to ballot for an assistant clerk, and the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, the gentlemen named to strike retired, and after sometime returned and reported, that Mr. George Howard was elected. ORDERED, That he qualify as such, by taking the several oaths required, subscribing a declaration of his belief in the christian religion, and by taking an oath that he will honestly, faithfully and diligently, discharge the office of assistant clerk to the house of delegates, and that he will not reveal or disclose the secrets thereof.
