

# VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1802.

A petition from Samuel Norwood, of Baltimore county, counter to the petition of Edward Nerwood, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

ORDERED, That Mr. Van-Horn and Mr. Martin be added to the said committee.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of Polly Gordy, of Worcester county, and the bill to alter and change the name of John Mills, of Anne, of Dorchester county, into the name of Crawford, severally endorsed; "By the senate, November 30, 1802: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

## M O N D A Y, December 6, 1802.

THE house met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Swearingen. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. E. Davis and Mr. Rose appeared in the house.

Mr. Thomas Williams, a delegate returned for Somerset county, appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking the oath to support the constitution of the United States, took his seat in the house.

The bill to incorporate the methodist episcopal church in this state, the supplement to an act, entitled, An act to prohibit the raising of swine and geese in Princess-Anne-town, in Somerset county, and the bill for the valuation of real and personal property within this state, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the report on the petition of James Ray have a second reading on Tuesday week next.

Petitions from Henry Reese and John Croxall, of Baltimore county, Thomas Gordon, of Talbot county, and John Wilson, of Washington county, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

A petition from Peter Levering and Noah Nelms, of the city of Baltimore, counter to the petition of John Cambell, of Somerset county, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

A petition from Lambert Beard, late collector of Cæcil county, praying an act may pass authorising him to collect by execution all monies due him as collector aforesaid, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Veazey, Mr. Sheredine and Mr. Miller, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Cornelius Comegys, and others, members of the methodist episcopal church of Kent county, praying an act may pass for incorporating them, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. A. Stuart, Mr. Angier and Mr. Nelson, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from John Harwood, and others, securities of Richard Johns, late sheriff of Talbot county, praying to be released from nine per cent. interest on a debt due the state as security aforesaid, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Rose, Mr. Nabb and Mr. Martin, to consider and report thereon.

The bill for the relief of John Nabb, of Talbot county, was read the second time, and the question put, That the said bill do pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
