

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1802.

Mr. Van-Horn, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for improving the navigation of the eastern branch of Patowmack river; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from Josiah Bayly, Thomas Bayly and Martin L. Haynie, in behalf of Henrietta Haynie, Charlotte Haynie and Richard Hamden Haynie, praying an act may pass appointing commissioners to sell and dispose of the real estate of doctor Ezekiel Haynie, lying in Somerset county, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Dashiell, Mr. Wilson and Mr. Cottman, to consider and report thereon.

The bill to direct the register of wills for Caroline county to keep his office in Denton, in said county, and there to deposit the records, books and papers, belonging to said office, was read the second time, and the question put, That the said bill do pass?
