

# VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1802.

The bill to incorporate the members of the Taney-town library company, in Frederick county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill for extending the benefit of struck juries to criminal cases, was read the second time and passed.

The bill to make public the proceedings of the levy courts in the several counties of this state, and to repeal part of an act of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time, and the question put, That the said bill do pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

A petition from Nathaniel Beall, of Montgomery county, praying a resolution may pass directing the treasurer to pay to him a sum of money which he heretofore paid on account of a recognizance which he entered into for the appearance of his negro man Will, which said Will failed to appear at court, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. T. Davis, Mr. Chapman and Mr. Bayard, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Quynn, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to enable the corporation of the city of Annapolis to lay a tax on property within the said city, and the precincts thereof, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The following resolution being propounded to the house, was read the first and second time and assented to.

RESOLVED, That the legislature, in respect to the memory of Richard Cromwell, who died on Saturday last, during his attendance to the discharge of his duties as a member of the house of delegates from Washington county, wear scarfs and bands during the remainder of this session, and that the funeral expences be placed on the journal of accounts.
