

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1802. 119

The message respecting the closing of the session was read the second time, agreed to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

John Johnson and James Houston, Esquires, from the senate, acquaint Mr. Speaker that the governor is waiting in the senate to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and request the attendance of this house for that purpose.

Mr. Speaker left the chair, and, attended by the members of this house, went to the senate, and there presented the following engrossed bills to the governor, who signed the same, and affixed the great seal thereto, in the presence of both houses.

No. 1. An act relative to the continuance of causes in the court of appeals, and to alter the time of holding the same.

No. 2. An act to settle and ascertain the salary of members of the council for the ensuing year.

No. 3. An act for the relief of John Erskine, of Talbot county.

No. 4. An act to authorise and empower the justices of the levy court of Charles county to levy a sum of money for the purpose of repairing the poor-house in said county.

No. 5. A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act for draining part of a branch called the Unicorn Branch, lying in the upper part of Queen-Anne's county.

No. 6. An act to lay out and open a road from the main road leading from the head of Chester to the head of Sassafras, in Kent county, to the Delaware line.

No. 7. An act further extending the time for making returns of certain certificates and plots.

No. 8. An act for the relief of Margaret Razer, of Frederick-town, in Frederick county.

No. 9. An act to lay out a road from M'Galister's plantation to Elisha and David Gorsuch's mill, and from thence to John Ruteledge's plantation.

No. 10. An act to extend the powers of the trustees of the poor of Montgomery county.

No. 11. An act to authorise the levy court of Dorchester county to permit a certain part of the public road leading from the head of Church creek to the town of Cambridge in the said county to be changed.

No. 12. An act to authorise and empower the justices of the levy court of Caroline county to discontinue so much of the public road as is therein mentioned.

No. 13. An act to declare the private road leading from Philip Hardcastle's mills, in Caroline county, until it intersects the main road leading from Greensborough to parson Keen's, a public highway.

No. 14. An act for the benefit of William Sprigg Bowie, of Prince-George's county.

No. 15. An act for the benefit of John A. Gillison, of the city of Baltimore.

No. 16. An act to lay out a road from William Sinclair's plantation to Vaughn's mine-run and Gunpowder mills, and from thence to the Owl branch.

No. 17. An act to empower the levy court of Talbot county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned.

No. 18. An act to empower the levy court of Prince-George's county to assess a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned.

No. 19. An act to empower the justices of the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned.

No. 20. An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to voters, and qualifications of voters.

No. 21. A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery in Havre-de-Grace for the purpose therein mentioned.

No. 22. An act to prevent swine and geese from going at large in the town of New-Market, in Dorchester county.

No. 23. A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to appoint and authorise commissioners to review and lay out the road therein mentioned in Harford county.

No. 24. A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to prevent the going at large of geese and swine in the town of Havre-de-Grace, in Harford county.

No. 25. An act appointing commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Denton, in Caroline county.

No. 26. An act for the benefit of William Thomas, of Prince-George's county.

No. 27. A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco.

No. 28. A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to erect a town in Montgomery county, and for other purposes.

No. 29. An act relating to the town of Havre-de-Grace.

No. 30. A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to authorise the laying out a public road from Thomas Underhill's mill to intersect the road leading from John Neal's to John Cox's, in Harford county.

No. 31. An act to authorise the trustees and other members of the German catholic church in the precincts of Baltimore to raise a sum of money by lottery for finishing said church.

No. 32. An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Worcester county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the support of Elizabeth Cowley, daughter of Henman Cowley.

No. 33. An act for the relief of Nathaniel Talbot, of Caroline county.

No. 34. An act to repeal an act, entitled, An act for the destruction of squirrels in Caroline county, passed November session, eighteen hundred.

No. 35. An act authorising the levy court of Saint-Mary's county to levy a sum of money for the rent of an office for the register of wills of said county.

No. 36. An act for the benefit of Thomas Hewitt, of George-town, in Kent county.

No. 37. An act for the relief of Jane Offutt, wife to Mordecai Burgess Offutt, Verlinda Beatty, wife to Charles Beatty, Rebecca Offutt, wife to James Offutt, of William, Mary Offutt, wife to James Doull Offutt, Cassandra Wade, wife to William Wade, Charles Offutt Jones, Elizabeth Edmondson, wife to William Edmondson, and Zadock Jones, all of Montgomery county.
