

# VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1803. — 19

Mr. Purnell, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of William McGrigor, of Worcester county; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The report on the petition of James Boarman was read the second time, the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Ridgely, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to finish the baptist frame meeting-house in Baltimore county; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to authorise the raising a sum of money by lottery to purchase a fire-engine and to erect pumps in the town of Easton, in Talbot county. ORDERED, That Mr. Lloyd, Mr. Meluy and Mr. Rose, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Saint-Mary's county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill for the valuation of real and personal property within this state, have a second reading on Thursday next.

The bill relative to lost land warrants, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill for the support of Anne Mills, of Montgomery county, was read the second time, and passed.

Mr. Dickson, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to authorise the building of a protestant episcopal church within the city of Baltimore, by the name of Saint-Peter's Church, and for other purposes, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and two; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Frederick county into election districts, endorsed; "By the senate, November 18, 1803: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Grahame and Mr. Roberts. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the support of Anne Mills, of Montgomery county, was sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Benjamin F. A. C. Dashiell, a delegate returned for Somerset county, appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking the oath to support the constitution of the United States, took his seat in the house.

Mr. Simkins, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Edward Montgomery, of Allegany county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Petitions from John Gray and Thomas Biddle, junior, of Cæcil county, Leonard Townshend, of Prince-George's county, Clement Waltham, of Harford county, John Parvin, Mark Parvin, William Parvin and Isaac Parvin, of Frederick county, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.
