THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Thompson and Mr. Ireland. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act for erecting a village at Choptank bridge, in Caroline county, and for other purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. Thomas, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of Hugh Ferguson, of Kent county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Lloyd, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a fire-engine and to erect pumps in the town of Easton, in Talbot county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Petitions from James Clarke, Vachel Dorsey, of Johnzey, John Lee, Benjamin Thomas and Owen Roberts, of Baltimore county, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. Hopewell, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of William Henry Lansdale and Thomas Reeder Lansdale, children of Mary Lansdale, of Saint-Mary's county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution respecting the appointment of a register of wills for Dorchester county, was read the second time, and the question put, That the house assent thereto? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
