Petitions from Michael Branson, William Price, William Nace and Thomas M'Laughlin, of Baltimore county, Daniel Knock, of Kent county, Philip Lewis, Henry Lenhart, Richard Phillips and Anthony Lamerlere, of the city of Baltimore, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

A memorial from sundry inhabitants of the state, praying that a penitentiary-house may be erected, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Dickson, Mr. Lemmon, Mr. Brown and Mr. Sheredine, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Peter Myers, of Frederick county, counter to the petition of Joshua Stevenson, of the county aforesaid, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petitions from sundry persons for acts of insolvency.

A petition from Robert Amos, of Harford county, praying a resolution may pass directing the treasurer to pay to him a sum of money which he heretofore overpaid for some property he purchased of the state, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Lytle, Mr. Montgomery and Mr. E. Davis, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Jasper Edward Tilley, of Anne-Arundel county, stating, that his mother suffered great loss from the depredations of the enemy during the revolution, and praying relief, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Harwood, Mr. Chapman, Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Dashiell and Mr. Miller, to consider and report thereon.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and requested to pay to Robert Amos, senior, the sum of five pounds one shilling and eight-pence current money, with interest from the twenty-first day of September, seventeen hundred and eighty-five, it being the balance due upon the treasurer's books to said Amos, upon a purchase made by him of confiscated property, arising from an over payment of his bond given at the time of the purchase from the intendant.
