Mr. Montgomery, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the bill to increase the tolls on the Susquehanna canal, and to repeal the third section of an act, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making the river Susquehanna navigable from the line of this state to tide water, as amended; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, the question was put, That leave be given to bring in a bill to direct the mode of proceeding where beasts shall be trespassing beyond the limits of their owners? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Cresap, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to repeal the second and third sections of an act, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the levy court of Allegany county relative to roads in said county; which was read the first and second time by especial order, and the question put, That the said bill do pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act respecting Ten Feet lane in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time by especial order, and the question put, That the said bill do pass? Determined in the negative.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill extending the time for taking the bond of the sheriff of Montgomery county. ORDERED, That Mr. T. Davis, Mr. Swearingen and Mr. Veatch, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Chapman, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act for amending, and reducing into system, the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill to reform the penal laws of this state, have a second reading on to-morrow.

On the second reading of the bill granting a loan of money to the trustees of the academy established in Easton, in Talbot county, the question was put, That the further consideration thereof be postponed till the next session of assembly? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Sturgis and Mr. Ireland being absent on leave, ORDERED, That Mr. Dashiell and Mr. Sheredine be added to the committee of claims.

The bill empowering the chancellor to direct a sale of the real estate of Priscilla Howerton, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.

On motion, the question was put, That the further consideration of the bill respecting the religious sect of people called Jews, be postponed till the next session of assembly? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. T. Davis, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act extending the time for taking the bond of the sheriff of Montgomery county; which was read the first and second time by especial order and passed.
