Mr. Shaaff, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled. An act respecting titles to land under decrees of chancery, and to facilitate the tracing of titles; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

assembly.

Mr. Shaaff, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act respecting taxes on judicial proceedings, and on the proceedings in the land-office, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

postponed till the next session of assembly.

The speaker laid before the house a report from Vachel Stevens, examiner general for the western shore,

stating the amount of fees received by him for the last year; which was read.

Mr. Harwood, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of repairing the protestant episcopal church in Ali-Hallows parish, in Anne-Arundel county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill for the relief of Richard Morgan, of Montgomery county, and Christopher Woolford, of Washing-

ton county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill to revive and continue an act to enable John S. Belt, James Walker and Archibald Dorsey, to complete the collection of the county tax in certain districts in Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The report on the petition of William Amos, senior, of Harford county, was read the second time and

concurred with. ORDERED, That the resolution contained in the said report be withdrawn.

The following resolution being propounded to the house, was read the first and second time, assented to, and

sent to the senate by the clerk.

RESOLVED, That the application of William Amos, senior, of Harford county, be and the same is hereby referred to the consideration of the auditor, who is requested to examine the same, and report to the next general assembly what sum, if any, is due to said Amos on account of expences incurred by him in superintending the execution of a commission which issued in behalf of the state, at the instance of the late intendant, to settle the lines of a tract of land lying in Harford county called The Grove, and that no proceedings, until the said report shall be made by the auditor as aforesaid, shall be commenced at law upon a bond given to the state by a certain Abraham Jarrett, with William Amos and Thomas Caldwell securities, for the purchase of the land gained by the state on the execution of the commission aforesaid.
