With respect to the object contained in the second resolution, your committee report, that they have visited and examined the government-house and furniture, the former appears to require considerable repairs, and additions are wanting to the latter. The committee are of opinion that it will require an appropriation of one thousand five hundred dollars for the repairs of the government-house, and the further sum of one thousand dollars for furniture that is absolutely necessary for the accommodation of the governor.
