With this view of the case, your committee, satisfied that the situation of the petitioner strongly recommends him to the aid and care of a dignified legislature, would beg leave to suggest the justice and propriety of the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed and required to pay unto Henry Gassaway, of the county of Anne-Arundel, late a lieutenant in the revolutionary war, a sum of money equal to half pay as a lieutenant, annually, in quarterly payments, during his life, as a further reward to those
