

The resolution in favour of Henry Gassaway was sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Selby, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to public roads in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of the town of Bladensburgh, in Prince-George's county, praying an act may pass to prevent swine from going at large in said town, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Covington, Mr. Berry and Mr. Contee, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Lloyd, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company, under the name of The Farmers Bank of Maryland, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for improving the navigation of Corsica creek, in Queen-Anne's county, was read the second time and passed.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill authorising Jacob Schnehely, late sheriff and collector of Washington county, to complete his collection, endorsed; "By the senate, November 21, 1804: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
