

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1804.

" By the senate, November 28, 1804: Read the second time by especial order and will pass.

F R I D A Y, November 30, 1804.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Alexander has leave of absence. Mr. B. Mackall appeared in the house. Mr. William Lyles, a delegate returned for Prince-George's county, appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking an oath to support the constitution of the United States, took his seat in the house.

On motion, the question was put, That the house reconsider the bill, entitled, An act to continue an act, entitled, An act relative to the administration of justice in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned? Resolved in the affirmative. On motion, the said bill was recommitted to the committee who were appointed to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Somervell, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Calvert county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ellicott, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to continue an act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Maryland insurance company, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-five; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from Henry Howard, late sheriff and collector of Anne-Arundel county, praying that a law may pass allowing him further time to complete his collections for the years 1801, 1802 and 1803, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Shaaff, Mr. Hall and Mr. Mercer, to consider and report thereon.

The house, agreeably to the order of the day, proceeded to the second reading of the bill to establish a bank, and incorporate a company under the name of The Farmers Bank of Maryland, and for other purposes, and the bill being read throughout, on motion, the question was put, That the further consideration thereof be postponed until to-morrow? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, That the said bill do pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
