

The bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Worcester county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, and the resolution in favour of John Snider, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

The report on the petition of James O'Bryon, was read the second time and the resolution therein contained assented to.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill to incorporate the stockholders in the union bank of Maryland, have a second reading on Thursday the sixth instant.

Mr. Montgomery, from the committee to whom was recommitted the bill, entitled, An act to continue an act, entitled, An act relative to the administration of justice in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, delivers to the speaker the said bill; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Shaaff, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising Henry Howard, late sheriff of Anne-Arundel county, to complete his collection; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorising the city commissioners to open and extend Water-street in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

A petition from Samuel Maynard, of the city of Annapolis, praying that the state's right to certain land may be released to him, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Shaaff, Mr. Stephen and Mr. Mercer, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Charles Mankin, of Charles county, praying to be released from the payment of a judgment obtained against him by the state, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. M'Pherson, Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Shaaff, Mr. Muir and Mr. Parnham, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Shaaff, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

RESOLVED, That this house will, on Friday next, resolve itself into a committee of the whole house on the said bill.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, praying that a law may pass to appoint commissioners to lay out anew the road from Baltimore towards Liberty-town, and that they may not be confined to straight lines in some parts and crooked ones in other parts. but that they may be empowered to locate the same in the best manner, according to their discretion, upon a view of the ground, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Brown, Mr. Lemmon, Mr. Clarke, Mr. Harryman and Mr. Sheredine, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Washington county, praying that a law may pass to establish a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore, westwardly, in the best direction, towards William's Port, in said county, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county praying that companies may be incorporated for the establishment of turnpike roads.
