RESOLVED, That the treasurers of the western and eastern shores respectively be and they are hereby directed not to deposit in any bank any specie or bank notes which hath been or may be received in the treasury, nor to exchange with any bank, directly or indirectly, for the notes of such bank, such specie or notes as may be received in the treasury of either shore, unless under the direction of the legislature.

The said resolution being read throughout, the question was put, Will the house assent thereto? Resolved in the affirmative.

The report on the petition of Benjamin Chambers, of Chester-town, was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Somerset and Worcester counties, stating, that a law passed last session, authorising the laying out a road on the divisional line between the counties aforesaid, and that the said law compelled the persons who held lands on the said road to pay the expence thereof, and that they think grievous and unjust to compel the aforesaid persons to pay the expence of the said road, as it will be a general benefit to have the said road, and praying that the expence of opening the said road may not be imposed on the persons aforesaid, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Prideaux, Mr. T. Bayly and Mr. Williams, to consider and report thereon.
