**T**HE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Ireland appeared in the house.

The bill, entitled, An act to empower the levy court of Dorchester county to appoint a constable for the village of New-Market in the said county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act to streighten and amend the public roads in Harford county, and to repeal the third section of the act of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The amendment proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to provide for the administration of justice in cases of crimes and misdemeanors in the city and county of Baltimore, was read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to erect a town in Talbot county by the name of Saint-Michael's, and to appoint commissioners, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act incorporating the justices of the levy court in the respective counties in this state for the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

**ORDERED**, That the printer to the state strike one hundred copies of the act, entitled, A further supplement to the act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, for the use of the levy courts and inspectors of tobacco within this state.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road to lead from the cross roads near Richard Caton's limekiln, in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones's Falls, to the city of Baltimore and the bill, entitled, An act to enlarge farther the powers of the trustees of the poor in the several counties therein mentioned, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

The house resumed the consideration of the bill for the encouragement of learning in this state, and for other purposes therein mentioned, and on further progression in reading said bill, the question was put, Shall the blank in the first clause of said bill after the words "Calvert county" be filled up with the sum of five hundred dollars? Resolved in the affirmative.

On further progression in reading said bill, the question was put, Shall the blank after the words "Charles county" in the same clause be filled up with the sum of nine hundred dollars? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, Shall the said blank be filled up with the sum of eight hundred dollars? Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, Shall Talbot county be inserted in said clause? Resolved in the affirmative.
