

# VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1804. 113

BELIEVING all the important business before the legislature can be finished by the 17th instant, we propose, with the concurrence of your house, to close the session on that day.

Which was read.

Mr. Montgomery, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and three; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, An act to erect a town in Talbot county by the name of St. Michael's, and to appoint commissioners, were read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the sale of certain lots of land lying westward of Fort Cumberland, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the representatives of Jeremiah Crabb, late of Montgomery county, deceased, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to keep in repair the road leading into Pratt-street in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy courts of Kent and Queen-Anne's counties to levy a sum of money for building a bridge over Chester river, at the Head of Chester, were read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The house adjourns till 6 o'clock.

## P O S T M E R I D I E M.

The house met.

The amendment proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, was agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out, open and clear, a road in Harford county, from a place known by the name of Darlington, to intersect the road leading from Belle-Air to Havre-de-Grace, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the levy court of Harford county in the case therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the vestry of Saint-Paul's parish, in Baltimore county, to draw a lottery within the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth Beall, of Montgomery county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to change the name of Jeremiah Perry to Jeremiah Perry Davis, was read the second time and passed.

A petition from Thomas Nicholls, of Simon, of Montgomery county, praying further time to enable him to pay a debt due from him to the state, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Lathicum, Mr. Swearingen and Mr. Darne, to consider and report thereon.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to vagrants in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, according to the order of the day, and the question put, Shall the bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed November session, eighteen hundred and three, was read the second time by a special order and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to empower the governor and council to direct a sale of any vacancy or vacancies adjoining to the land lately belonging to the Principio and Nottingham companies, was read the second time and passed.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill to authorise a lottery or lotteries to raise a sum of money for the improvement of the navigation of the river Susquehanna. ORDERED, That Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Stephen, Mr. Shaaff, Mr. Stansbury and Mr. Miller, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act in favour of the president and directors of the towmack company and the commissioners of the Federal buildings, was read the second time and passed.

The resolution authorising the governor and council to contract with some person for building a house as a depository for the powder belonging to the state, was read the second time and assented to.
