BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, JANUARY 16, 1805.

GENTLEMEN OF THE SENATE,

WE propose to proceed immediately to the election of two directors on the part of this state in the Union bank of Maryland. Thomas Dickson, Benjamin Williams, James L. Hawkins, Philip Moore, John Comegys, John Kim, junior, James John Wilkinson, James Armstrong and James G. Wood, are put in nomination by this house. Mr. Stephen and Mr. T. Bayly are appointed by the house of delegates to join the gentlemen to be appointed by you in the examination of the ballots; and to regulate the manner of said election, we have adopted the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the two directors to be appointed on the part of this state in the Union bank of Maryland, be elected by ballot, and the two persons having a majority of the ballots of all the attending members of both
