Mr. Carroll, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of sundry inhabitants of Montgomery county, praying that the road, which by an act of the last session of assembly, was directed to be opened from Barnesville, in Montgomery county, to Zachariah Maccubbins's mill, and thence to intersect the main road leading from Frederick-town to George-town, at or near Log-town, might be opened by those immediately interested, and not at the expence of the county at large, have given the same all due consideration, and beg leave to report, that whereas by the act of November session, one thousand eight hundred and five, entitled, An act to open a road from Barnesville, in Montgomery county, to Zachariah Maccubbins's mill, and thence to intersect the main
