T H U R S D A Y, December 11, 1806.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Shaaff, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act concerning the chancery court; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from the securities of Thomas Williams, former collector of Prince-George's county, praying to be reimbursed for poundage fees overpaid by them on a fieri facias issued against them as securities aforesaid, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. B. Hodges, Mr. Woodward, Mr. Callis, Mr. Hall and Mr. M. Pherson, to consider and report thereon.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the benefit of Charles Thomas Clarke and William Hall, devised of Benjamin Hall, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, endorsed "will not pass." And a letter from the register of the land-office, enclosing his account of taxes; which was read.

A memorial from the constables of the city of Baltimore, counter to the petition of John Hunter, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

A memorial from Ignatius Middleton, of Charles county, counter to the memorial of sundry inhabitants of said county, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the memorial to which it is counter.

Mr. Mitchell, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising the proprietors of the French town and New Castle water and land stages to open a road from French town, in Cæcil county, to intersect the divisional line between this state and the state of Delaware, at a road laid out by the commissioners of New Castle county, in the state of Delaware; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Kent county, praying a piece of ground may be condemned for the purpose of building a ferry-house thereon, at a place called The Narrows, was preferred; read, and referred to Mr. Frisby, Mr. Chapman, Mr. Comegys, Mr. Pearce and Mr. Sudler, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Henry Ksepka, praying a special act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

On motion, ORDERED, That the consideration of the bill to regulate and discipline the militia of this state be postponed until to-morrow.
