The bill for the relief of Samuel Jones, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. Biggs, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to invest certain powers in the levy court of Frederick county for the purposes therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to lay out, open and improve, the road leading from Hancock, in Washington county, to Cumberland, in Allegany county. ORDERED, That Mr. Bruce, Mr. Bowles and Mr. Briscoe, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill for the benefit of John Munickhuysen, and others, was read the second time and passed.

The report on the petition of Nicholas Leaman was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

Mr. Bruce, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Allegany county to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; which was read the first and second time by especial order and passed.

The bill authorising the levy court of Allegany county to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, the bill for the relief of Samuel Jones, of the city of Baltimore, and the resolution in favour of Nicholas Leaman, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for erecting a village at Choptank bridge, in Caroline county, and for other purposes therein mentioned, be recommitted for amendment.

The bill to enable the levy court of Washington county to alter and change the direction of a road therein mentioned, and the bill to prevent the going at large of swine in the village of Hillsborough, in Caroline county, and for other purposes therein mentioned, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Street, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act to read into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate said elections; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to public roads in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned. ORDERED, That
