the case may be, shall thereupon proceed to advertise and to sell the goods or chattels thus levied on, at the valuation equal to wheat at 1121 cents per bushel, and tobacco at 6 dollars per hundred weight, to be accertained by three respectable appraisers to be selected by the sheriff, or other proper officer, for that purpose."
