Mr. Hopper, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for erecting buildings for the use of the poor in Queen-Anne's county, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Seth, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the better regulation of apprentices, as amended; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
