The bill annulling the marriage of Charles Farrow, and Anne his wife, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the erection of a new court-house for Baltimore county. ORDERED, That Mr. Stansbury, Mr. R. Steuart and Mr. Brown, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The following resolution was read.

RESOLVED, That ——— be and they are hereby authorised, under the direction of the governor and council, to cause to be repaired, or rebuilt, the whole, or such parts of the armory at Easton, in Talbot county, as may be necessary for the reception and safe keeping of the public arms and military stores, and that the expense thereof be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

A petition from Frederick Green, printer to the state, praying an advance of 600 dollars on account of his next year's salary, to enable him to purchase paper, and other materials, for the work of the ensuing fall session, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Boyle, Mr. Chapman and Mr. Muir, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. R. Steuart, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report :

THE committee to whom was referred the memorial of the justices of the levy court of Baltimore county, report, that they have had the same under their consideration, and are of opinion that as the commissioners appointed to superintend the erection of the penitentiary, to which subject the memorial relates, have not made any representation to this general assembly, which your committee think necessary to justify a further appropriation of money for carrying fully into effect the design of the legislature in patronizing the said work ; and that as no information has been communicated by which the sum necessary to progress the said design of the legislature can be ascertained, the memorial ought to be referred to the consideration of the next general assembly. All which is submitted.

By the HOUSE of DELEGATES, June 8, 1809.

Gentlemen of the Senate,
THE honourable Edward Lloyd, Esquire, having been elected governor of the state of Maryland, we have appointed Mr. ——— and Mr. ———, jointly with such gentlemen as shall be named by your house, to wait
