

# VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, JUNE SESSION, 1809.

**RESOLVED**, That the register of the land-office of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed to grant to the said Samuel Brown a warrant for twelve hundred and eighty-six acres of land in Allegany county, upon the said Samuel Brown's paying to the said register the fees of office for the same. All which is submitted.

FRIDAY, June 9, 1809.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The resolution in favour of Frederick Green, the resolution relative to the penitentiary, the message relative to a senator of the United States, and the bill for the preservation and distribution of the vaccine matter for the use of the citizens of this state, with the message requesting a reconsideration of the same, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

The clerk of the senate delivers the supplement to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the erection of a new court-house for Baltimore county, and the bill authorising John Mitchell, late sheriff and collector of Caroline county, to complete his collection, severally endorsed, "will not pass." Also the bill to authorise the governor and directors of the Susquehanna canal company to raise a sum of money by lottery for the purpose therein mentioned, the additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of
