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A sufficient number of delegates being convened, they severally qualified in the presence of each other, by taking the several oaths required by the constitution and form of government, by subscribing a declaration of their belief in the Christian religion, and by taking, repeating and subscribing, the oath to support the constitution of the United States.

The house proceeded to ballot for a speaker; the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, on examination thereof it appeared, that Tobias E. Stansbury, Esquire, was elected.

Mr. John Brewer was appointed clerk. ORDERED, That he qualify as such, by taking the several oaths required, by subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian religion, and by taking an oath that he will honestly, faithfully and diligently, discharge the office of Clerk to the House of Delegates, and that he will not reveal or disclose the secrets thereof.

Mr. William Sanders Green was appointed assistant clerk. ORDERED, That he qualify as such, by taking the several oaths required, by subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian religion, and by taking an oath that he will honestly, faithfully and diligently, discharge the office of Assistant Clerk to the House of Delegates, and that he will not reveal the secrets thereof.

The house appointed Mr. Cornelius Mills sergeant at arms, and Mr. John Sullivan doorkeeper. ORDERED, That they be qualified.

ORDERED, That Mr. John E. Spencer and Mr. Davis inform the Reverend Mr. Wyatt, that the house request he will perform Divine Service every morning at the usual hour of meeting.
