nagers and company, of the Baltimore and Frederick-town turnpike road company, for dividends on stock, £ 28 2 6; from Benjamin Harwood, trustee, for dividends of interest and reimbursement of principal on stock, 9,119 9 21; from William Marbury, for a balance due from him on the auditor's books, £5,054 7 10; from the United States, for dividends of interest and reimbursement of principal on stock transferred to the treasurer of the western shore, in behalf of, and for the use of, the state of Maryland, £20,656 10 4; from the United States, it being for so much eight per cent. stock redeemed, £ 28,687 10 0; and from Robert Wright, Esquire, late governor of Maryland, the sum of £450 9 0.

It appears to your committee, that in conformity to a resolution of November session, 1808, the treasurer has invested, in behalf of the state of Maryland, 70,000 dollars in stock of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, 30,000 dollars in stock of the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, 5,000 dollars in the Baltimore and York-town turnpike road stock, and 5,000 dollars in the Baltimore and Frederick-town turnpike road stock, amounting, in the

whole, to the sum of 110,000 dollars.

It appears to your committee, that in conformity to a resolution of November session, 1806, the treasurer has paid the sum of £ 1,466 2 10 in discharge of bills of exchange, drawn according to an act of assembly passed at November session, 1779, entitled, An act for calling out of circulation certain bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly, which bills of exchange your committee have examined and cancelled.

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of said treasurer, he hath paid the sum of £ 10 9 4, agreeably to the resolutions of November session, 1797, in discharge of a certificate issued pursuant to an act

of May session, 1781, which certificate your committee have examined and cancelled.

That it also appears to your committee, the said treasurer hath paid away, from the first of November, 1808, to the first of November, 1809, the sum of £56,547 8 6 specie, for all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts, and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 138,596 dollars 10 cents funded six per cent. stock, 495,356 dollars 61 cents deferred six per cent. stock, 263,472 dollars 26 cents funded three per cent. stock, £ 2,099 7 10 of the emissions of bills of credit made by an act of congress of the 18th of March, 1780, and the sum of £24,920 14 0 specie; which sum of specie is appropriated in the manner following, viz.
