

On motion by Mr. Wilkinson, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act concerning the poor in the poor's house of Calvert county. ORDERED, That Mr. Wilkinson, Mr. Blake and Mr. Ireland, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill for the benefit of Elizabeth Barnet, of Washington county, was read the second time and passed.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill to alter such parts of the declaration of rights, constitution and form of government, as prevent persons conscientiously scrupulous of taking an oath from serving as jurors; and, on motion by Mr. C. Dorsey, the question was put, That the words "except in criminal cases that are capital, and upon petitions for freedom," be inserted after the word "jurors?" The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

On motion by Mr. C. Dorsey, the further consideration of the said bill was postponed until to-morrow. The house proceeded to ballot for two directors in the Farmers Bank of Maryland, two for the branch of said bank at Easton, two for the Union Bank of Maryland, two for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, and one for the Hagar's-town Bank; the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, the gentlemen named to strike retired, and after sometime returned and reported, that for the Farmers Bank of Maryland William Kilty and Nicholas Brewer were elected; for the Branch Bank of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, at Easton, David Kerr, junior, and John Kennard, were elected; for the Union Bank of Maryland Samuel Wright and Thomas Dixon were elected; for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore Tobias E. Stansbury and Peter Little were elected; and for the Hagar's-town Bank Henry Lewis was elected. Whereupon

RESOLVED, That William Kilty and Nicholas Brewer be, and they are hereby declared to be, directors on the part of this state for the ensuing year in the Farmers Bank of Maryland; that David Kerr, junior, and John Kennard be, and they are hereby declared to be, directors on the part of this state for the ensuing year in the Branch Bank of the Farmers Bank of Maryland at Easton; that Samuel Wright and Thomas Dixon be, and they are hereby declared to be, directors on the part of this state for the ensuing year in the Union Bank of Maryland; that Tobias E. Stansbury and Peter Little be, and they are hereby declared to be, directors on the part of this state for the ensuing year in the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore; and that Henry Lewis be, and he is hereby declared to be, a director on the part of this state for the ensuing year in the Hagar's-town Bank.

On motion by Mr. Cottman, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to ascertain the allowance to jurymen and witnesses of the general court, and the several county courts and orphans courts in this state. ORDERED, That Mr. Cottman, Mr. Bayly and Mr. Archer, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Brent, the bill annulling the marriage of Conrad Hogmire and Catheriae Hogmire, was referred to the next general assembly.

On motion by Mr. Worthington, ORDERED, That the bill concerning divorces have a second reading on Friday the 15th instant.

Mr. Davis delivers a bill, entitled, An act to open a road to Swan creek, in Harford county, and to make a public landing thereat; which was read.

The further supplement to an act authorising a lottery for raising a sum of money for repairing of Saint-George's church, on Deer creek, in Harford county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill to empower the inhabitants of the town of Havre-de-Grace to elect the commissioners thereof, was read the second time and passed.

At a quarter before three o'clock, on motion, the question was put, That the house adjourn? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
