ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments, be referred to the next general assembly of Maryland; and as the bill proposes, at the expense of the state, to establish the penitentiary-house at Baltimore for a new system of punishments in Maryland, that it be published with the acts of this session for the consideration of the people.

Mr. Wharton delivers a petition from the commissioners and trustees of Rockville academy, praying a donation; which was read and referred to Mr. Wharton, Mr. J. H. Thomas, Mr. S. Thomas, Mr. Herbert and Mr. Gaither, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Worthington delivers a petition from Edward Aisquith and John W. Glenn, praying the right of the state to certain property may be released to them; which was read and referred to Mr. Worthington, Mr. M. Brown and Mr. Bland, to consider and report thereon.

And a petition from Louis Rodrigues, of the city of Baltimore, praying a repeal of the law establishing a medical society; which was read and referred to Mr. Worthington, Mr. Bland and Mr. Seth, to consider and report thereon.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill respecting a monument or statue to the memory of Washington; on motion by Mr. Worthington, the same was postponed until to morrow.

The house, according to the order of the day, proceeded to the second reading of the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts, and, on motion by Mr. J. Brown, the question was put, That the further consideration thereof be postponed? Determined in the negative.
